

Ofsted visited the school on 5th and 6th November to carry out a full section 5 inspection. The lead inspector was Liam Colcough. Whilst the school is judged as 'Requires Improvement' for the quality of education and Early Years, the report acknowledged that due to the support of the Trust, a lot of progress has been made since the school joined in Spring term 2024. The inspection team recognised the sense of urgency the Trust and current leadership have in driving school improvement and the impact they have had in a short period of time. They have judged leadership and management to be 'Good' which is extremely rare when the quality of education is not considered good. Ofsted commented, "New leaders have introduced significant changes to the school. The rate of change has accelerated since September 2024. Governors and trustees have an accurate view of the areas of the school that need continued development."

The school is now on a journey to improve the quality of education to ensure that pupils at the school are equipped with the skills they for high school life.
